
Head Lice –what we do to manage it at HHP

There have been a few frequent questions asked concerning head lice checks. Head lice is a common issue in every elementary school. At HHP, Cherie Thomas, Educational Assistant, does monthly checks in every classroom. Checks are not done for the months of December and March, as we have Winter Break and Spring Break in those months. To date, six checks per classroom have been done. If a student is found to have louse, live eggs or dead eggs a letter is given to the child to take home. If, during the check there are no signs of louse or eggs, then no letter goes home. As a precautionary step, it is a good idea for all parents to also check their children for lice on a regular basis. If parents have questions about their child's head checks please contact Cherie Thomas at the school.
